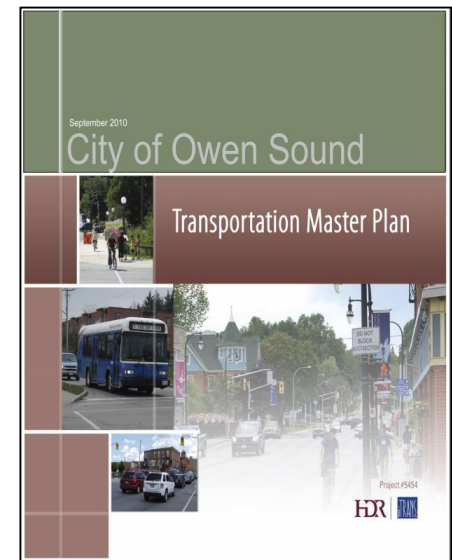
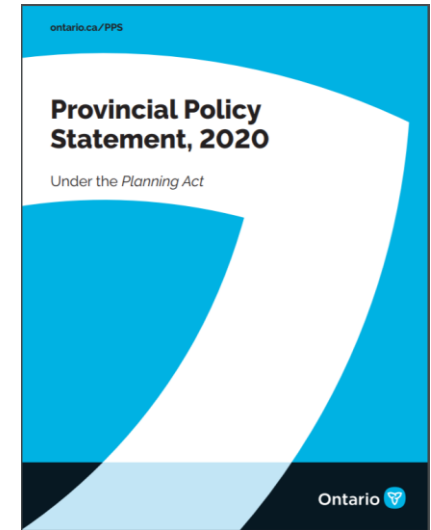
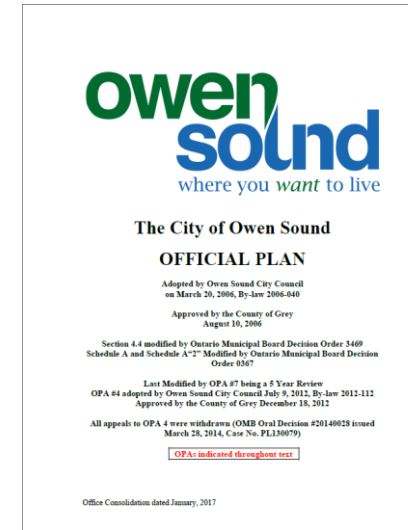
Purpose of Open House

Need for Official Plan Update

- Current Official Plan was adopted in 2006 and there was a need to review to address changes in the City and plan for the future
- Review and ensure consistency with Provincial Policy Statement (PPS)
- Assess conformity with applicable planning policies (Grey County Official Plan, NEP)
- Implement recommendations from other adopted Master Plans & Studies

Public Consultation Process to Date

Community involvement is an important component of an Official Plan update.

Up to this point, opportunities to provide comments have included:

A Council Visioning exercise was also completed as input to the Vision Statement.

Official Plan Vision Statement

“The City of Owen Sound is where you want to live. A complete community that values the natural environment, cultural diversity, historic streetscapes, vibrant waterfront and provides a sense of belonging. The City will plan to evolve as a centre for growth, opportunity and innovation while ensuring that sustainability, resiliency, and quality of life are considered in every decision.”

Sustainability & Climate Change

- Introduce policies to address and respond to a changing climate
- Provide policies and support for more sustainable transportation options (e.g. active transit, EV charging stations)
- Support low impact and energy efficient developments
- Provide clear policy for supporting 'Living Streets' with an active transportation focus



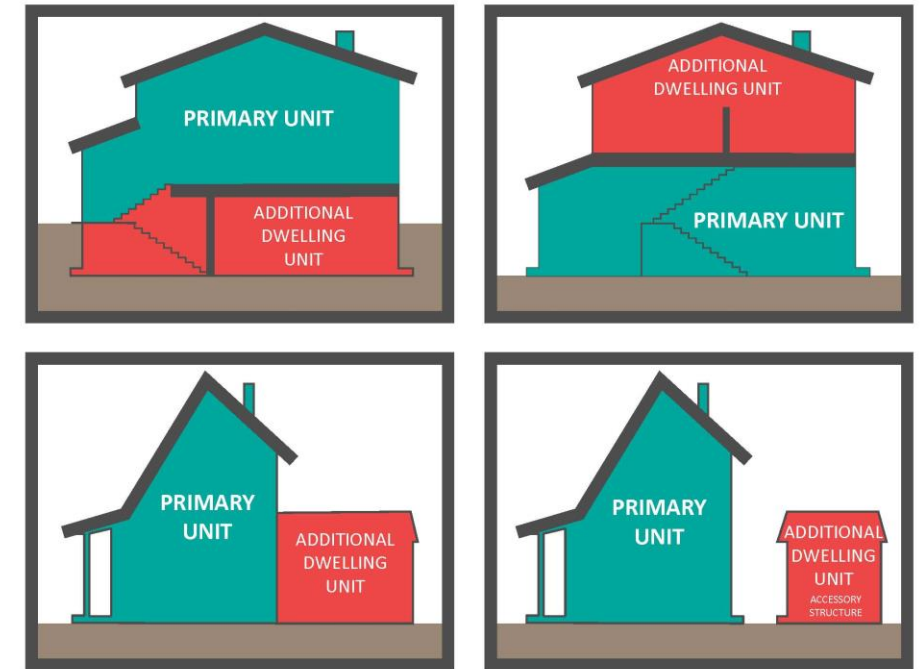

Housing & Affordability

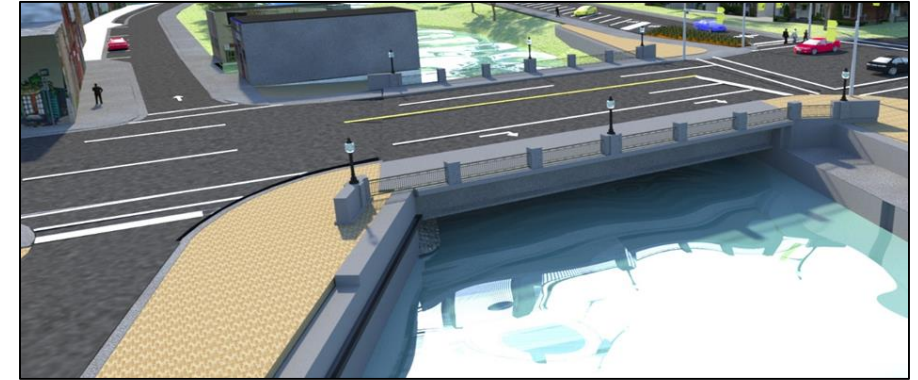
- Simplify Additional Dwelling Unit (ADU) policies and provide direction for ADUs
- Encourage a balance of low, medium and high density residential uses where appropriate
- Provide additional direction and policy support for day-care centres and group homes
- Strengthen affordable and rental housing policy direction



Examples of ADU types and locations

Transportation & Infrastructure

- Introduce policies to support infrastructure needs for capital projects (funding, grants, incentives, etc.)
- Strengthen policies that promote active transit infrastructure and connectivity to trails and parks
- Provide policies and support to become increasingly connected via high-speed internet
- Support the efficient use of existing transportation and infrastructure systems for development

Land Use & Design

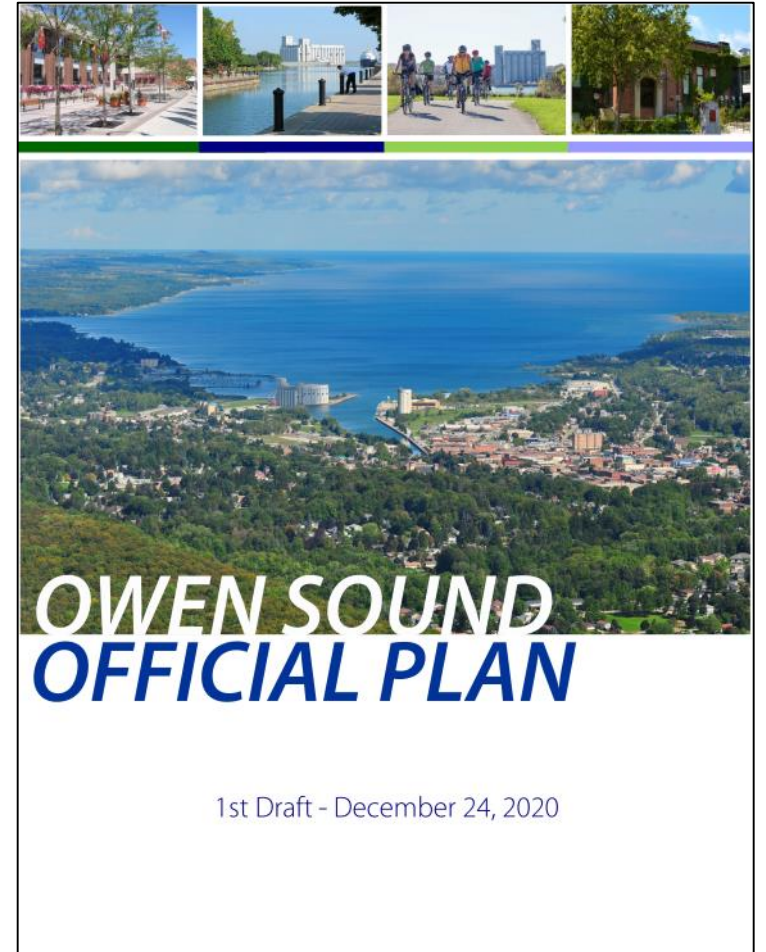
- Introduce updated density targets for small, medium and high density residential development
- Simplify the naming of land use areas within the City to conform to current strategies (e.g. Downtown → River District)
- Introduce further direction on the collection of cash-in-lieu of parkland dedications fees
- Introduce policies that support safety and security through development design

Summary Conclusion

- Process to update Official Plan has followed approved Terms of Reference and Planning Act requirements
- Proposed draft Official Plan brings document into conformity with Provincial and County policies
- Policies proposed to be amended and/or new policies provide appropriate balance and direction for future land use and sustainability



Public Comments – (received to date)

- Need for greater policy direction for climate change and incorporation of a Climate Action Plan
- No mention of climate change in "Quality of Life", "Urban Design", or "Infrastructure"
- Ensure that we are not only encouraging, but requiring sustainable action
- Density associated with a sustainable community and impacts of intensification
- Support for intensification and alternative dwelling unit types
- Waste management technology and use (i.e., green bins)
- Need to maintain cultural heritage policies
- Property specific input from stakeholders
- Confirmation on timing for Council consideration relative to timing and incorporation of public input

Next Steps to Council Adoption and Approval

January – February 2021

- Consider public input and comments
- Review agency circulation comments
- Provide notice of Special Meeting of Council
- Public Meeting – February 8th
- Prepare Technical Report
- Update draft Official Plan based on comments

Next Steps to Council Adoption and Approval

March – April 2021

- Special Meeting of Council – March 15th
- Finalize Official Plan and Prepare a Recommendation Report for Council Consideration and Adoption
- Following Council adoption, Official Plan is forwarded to County for final review and approval. New Official Plan comes into effect following issuance of County approval (subject to any notice/appeal period)
